Become an ARCH Leader

The ARCH Program was developed to help students with disabilities succeed in a college or training program through peerto-peer training and support.

The College Support Program will assist college students in many ways, below are a few of the basics needs we have identified that college students with disabilities has struggle with.

Leadership Training

Wanting to help someone else is half the battle, now through our weekend basic leadership training we will learn ways and gain new ideas to make this program work.

Note Takers

Many students that come in and need disability services will also need someone to help them take notes. So one of our jobs will be to become note takes for our class help find note takers for students.

Internship

In every field there is an internship requirement. This can be at your home school or the local High School or Technical College. If you are majoring in a field and this doesn't fit, volunteer we still need the help.

Mentoring Program

Volunteer to become a mentor to a student in the ARCH Program or another student through disability services. You can let disability services know what your major is and inform them you are available to mentor a student in your field. This can be at your home school or the local High School or Technical College.

Support System

Become the support system for a disabled student. Let them know you are there for them. You can do this in a group or individually.

Weekly Event

As a group and in your leadership training you will come up with a schedule of activities that will help you bond more with the students in the program. This can be as simple as eating dinner together or meeting in the library just to discuss how things are going.

Group Activities

This can be monthly, and/or take place of one of your weekly events. The key is group. The weekly event can just be the mentor and their mentee or a few getting together whereas this activity needs to include everyone involved.



Community Service

This can be a group or individual effort to be planned during the leadership training.
